

The Chuo Summer Program 2015 June 29 to July 10, 2015 (2 weeks)

Chuo University has been offering summer program for students interested in Japanese language and culture since 2002. The **Chuo Summer Program** aims to develop international students' understanding of Japan through daily experiences both on and off campus, and consists of the following components, all conducted **in English**:

- "Taking a Closer Look at Japan" Courses
- Japanese Culture and Sports Activities

Japan is one of the oldest and yet most modernized countries in the world, and Tokyo is an energetic and exciting city, a gateway to the unique and fascinating culture of Japan. Chuo University

Chuo University was founded in 1885 as the English Law School in Tokyo, and is one of the largest and most prestigious private universities in Japan, with high standards of teaching and research. It consists of six Faculties, seven Graduate Schools, two Professional Graduate Schools, and nine Research Institutes, and enrolls approximately 27,000 students including about 800 international students from more than 30 different countries every year. Chuo University has three campuses: Tama Campus, Korakuen Campus, and Ichigaya Campus. The



Chuo Summer Program is held on the Tama Campus, located in the hills of suburban western Tokyo surrounded by beautiful nature. Program participants will have free access to a wide variety of excellent facilities, including libraries, computer rooms, cafeterias, sports facilities, media laboratory, etc.

Assessment

A Certificate of Completion and a Certificate of Attendance will be issued by the International Center, Chuo University. This program does not offer academic credit; therefore, no grades are offered to student participants. Nevertheless, students' home institutions may offer their own credits for this program and students may take the program as an integral part of the degree program at their home institutions.

Requirements

Applicants must be enrolled as full-time students at Chuo's Partner institutions at the time the program commences.

<u>NO</u> Japanese language proficiency needed. The applicant whose native language is <u>not</u> English will be required to submit proof of English language proficiency when submitting the application form.

How to Apply

Deadline: March 20, 2015 *Program participants are limited to 20 international students a year.

For students at Chuo University's partner institutions, application forms can be obtained from international coordinators at their home institutions from the middle of January 2015. Students must apply via international coordinators of their home institutions; direct applications will not be accepted. Student may download the application forms from the Chuo website at:
